If your completed Cloud Checklist shows that cloud computing could help your business, your next step is to find a cloud services provider that you can partner with for all of your cloud service needs. Here's a list of questions you should begin thinking about as you continue researching your cloud options.

Eventually, you'll want to work with a provider to answer these questions, as they require some technical assistance to answer. Having answers to these questions will help you transition to the cloud.

- Which internet connection do we use?
  (DSL, cable, fiber-optic, dedicated leased lines)
- 2.Do we currently have enough upload and download internet bandwidth to support a cloud environment?
- 3. How many users do we have?
- 4. Do we utilize 3rd party resources like Office 365 from Microsoft or Amazon Web services?
- 5. Do we have Outlook email or calendars through Office 365?
- 6. Do we utilize any 3rd party standalone email applications – that would need to be integrated (or installed and configured)?
- 7. Do we utilize any 3rd party applications that would need to be integrated (CRM, Inventory, Statistics, Credit Card Processing)?
- 8. Do we have anti-virus or malware software?

- 9. Are our workloads seasonal, cyclical or variable?
- 10. What are our storage capacity requirements?
- 11. Do we have specific compliance requirements?
- 12. Do we have manufacturing equipment that would need to talk to the Cloud?
- 13. How does the Cloud environment relate to the rest of our IT infrastructure?
- 14. Do our end users need support?
- 15. Do we need to have Cloud plans reviewed and approved by key stakeholders?
- 16. Do we have a legal team that can evaluate a Cloud contract?
- 17. Do we need resources and capabilities for solution design, migration planning and ongoing support?
